ATTENDANCE POLICY

REMEMBER THAT STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO ATTEND ALL MEETINGS UNLESS THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA ARE MET

- You are absent from school due to illness
- You have a prearranged excused absence from school
- You are participating in a school-sponsored extracurricular activity AND ALL your grades are a 'C' or above (you can only be excused if the grade criteria is met)
- \rightarrow You are expected to notify UB staff <u>in advance</u> of any expected absence AND
- → All UB students <u>must attend at least one full UB meeting every</u> 4 weeks, regardless of extracurricular involvement
- \rightarrow Unexcused absences may result in the loss of program services

REQUIRED **RIGOROUS COLLEGE PREPARATORY CURRICULUM**

As an Upward Bound participant, you are required to take a rigorous collegepreparatory curriculum and the amount of **your UB stipend is contingent upon it.** *Why?*

The course of studies students take in high school is one of the most important factors in determining who succeeds in college.

College admissions personnel look closely at the classes students take, particularly in their junior and senior years of high school, to assess whether a student is serious about going to college and willing to make the hard choice to take classes that will academically prepare them for college. Several state institutions now *require* (not just recommend) that a student have completed these courses to be eligible for admission. Additionally, some are recalculating grade point average (GPA) for just these courses to determine admission and scholarships. This could drastically impact your admission and scholarship offers for college.

Plus, a rigorous college-prep curriculum gives students the academic foundation they need to tackle college-level classes. A rigorous college-prep plan for high school will include:

- \Rightarrow 4 Years of English
- \Rightarrow 4 Years of math (including Algebra I & II, Geometry), with a math course taken during senior year
- \Rightarrow 3 years of lab science, including one year each of at least two of the following courses: biology, chemistry and physics
- \Rightarrow 3 years of social studies
- \Rightarrow 2 years of a language other than English

Plan for your college success by scheduling your high school classes so you meet these requirements!
